Arbor Accounts: Please can you ensure that all payments on your Arbor accounts are up to date ready for the new school year.

Holiday food offer: Asda has announced that children can eat for just £1 at any time of day in Asda Cafés, seven days a week, with no minimum adult spend required. This offer is available every day from 25th July until 4th September 2022. Ella's kitchen baby food is included in this offer too.

Disco: Children in KS1 are to bring a change of clothes- we will change them and take them through.

KS2 will not be permitted to walk home after the disco. Please can you make sure they do NOT bring mobile phones or devices with them.

PE KITS: Next year we will be returning to having PE Kits kept in school and children will change whilst at school for their relevant PE lessons. Parents will need to ensure their children have a full PE kit in a blue kit bag in school at the start of the term. These will be sent home half termly for washing. If you have younger children, it is essential to ensure they can dress themselves independently as this is an important life skill.
