Christopher Wren



Sir Christopher Wren was a 17th century English architect, designer, astronomer and geometer. He designed 51 churches in London after the Great Fire of London, including St. Paul's Cathedral

Samuel Pepys



Samuel Pepus lived in London during the Great Fire of London and wrote about it in his diary

Thomas Farriner



Thomas Farriner is the owner of the bakery on Pudding Lane where the fire started

The fire gets very close to the Tower of London.

Tuesday 4th September 1666 St Paul's Cathedral is destroyed by the fire.

Timeline of Events

Sunday 2nd September 1666

The fire starts at 1 a.m.

Mid-morning: Samuel Pepys starts to write about the fire in his diary.

Wednesday 5th September 1666

The wind dies down and the fire spreads more slowly.

Thursday 6th September 1666

The fire is finally put out. Thousands of people are left homeless.
