HSSP Membership (Harlow School Sports Partnership)	£1000	All pupils from Years 2-6 have the opportunity to compete in a variety of competitions.	An average of 70% of Key Stage 2 pupils have attended a School Games event (Level Two) a significantly higher proportion than last year. The school has achieved success in these events notably Girls Football and Tag Rugby. Within Key Stage 1 two teams entered a gymnastics event, and also participated in a Football Festival. Please see our schoolgames.com blog for details. Children also receive medals and certificates promoting pride in both sport and their achievements. This organisation also runs CPD events which two members of staff have attended and fed back on. Through the HSSP CPD (Continuing Professional Development) is available at a variety of times in the year.
Qualified PE teacher	£9938	Our qualified PE teacher is used to train the teachers in effective teaching of PE. He teaches each class for two terms of the year. Further to this he also leads two extra-curricular activities. AP teaches for 6 hours per week and 1.5 hours of extra-curricular work per week.	Teachers gain in confidence from observing and duplicating lessons taught by the specialist. We are able to offer a wider range of extra-curricular activities due to his expertise. For the extra-curricular provision we have now a high number of children participating in sports with 80% of the school taking at least one club For our SEND children we have a 75% uptake for clubs with 50% attending at least one inter school tournament. 64% of our children have now attended at least one club with a large number (55% ) of them attending an event, of the children who are not attending all of them have been given reminders and opportunities to participate.

Additional extra-curricular club provision	£956.51	Implementation of a whole key stage football club allowing 30 more children access to the club than previously.	Has also allowed a fixtures only club to be set up resulting in more inter-school competition for Years 5 & 6, and better progress in Harlow Town school's Coxhead Cup. Implementation of a Key Stage 2 Athletics club, currently attended by over 50 children due to extra staff support.
Qualified Karate Sensei	£962.00	We hire a qualified karate instructor who is a 4 <sup>th</sup> Dan sensei at a Harlow Club. This gives us an affiliation with an outside organisation. He runs two extra-curricular clubs for KS1 and KS2. JB teaches 1.5 hours of extra-curricular per week.	The students learn the ethos of the martial art. An extra-curricular activity is offered after school and has a high number of participants. The clubs provide martial arts for both KS1 and KS2. Pupils have a chance to learn a variety of different physical and mental attributes.
New equipment for a variety of sports	£700 requested	We have purchased new equipment for tag rugby, football (shin pads, kit and bibs), netball (bibs and balls) and general equipment to replace defective equipment.	The new equipment has allowed PE lessons to be taught to a higher standard. The defective equipment replaced has fulfilled the safeguarding requirements for PE. The new equipment allows for a variety of sports to be taught in lessons and extra-curricular activities.
