British Science Week 2024: This year's British science week was focussed on time. This covered all aspects of time: Science through the ages; daily time; recording of timings; changes over time and growth and development. In class the school looked at two different investigations. Key stage one looked at what materials were best to make a boat. They looked at which material allowed their boats to stay a float for longest and whilst holding the greatest weight. Key Stage 2 tried to answer the question does longer legs mean you run the fastest. All the children had great fun getting hands on with science trying to problem solve and hypothesis and then being able to run the investigation to solve problems. I hope all the children had a fantastic time experiencing science this British science week.
