PSHE – Relationships

This week we are learning to: understand empathy and kindness/understand the concept of grit.

Starter: Take a moment to think about what *empathy* means to you. Write or draw your thoughts on a coloured piece of paper (you could use a blank piece of paper and then colour it as well) and share them with your family. With your family, generate a list of **acts of kindness** that you can do during these times.

Activity 1: To begin a diary – This diary that you will start this week will help you to record your feelings and thoughts during this different time. Why is it important to record how you are feeling? This week's diary focus is going to be on what acts of kindness you can do for yourself or your family. Can you decide which acts of kindness you will complete this week? How are you going to ensure that you complete your acts of kindness?

Grit is something that individuals can have as a character trait. Grit means to demonstrate **passion** and **perseverance** towards a long-term goal. This trait is characterized by a need to achieve objectives despite the hurdles that may come along the way. Click [here](#) for further instruction about grit.

Activity 2: Once you have thought about your character traits and what it takes to develop **grit**, create your own **cartoon storyboard** to identify the area that you need to work on in order to gain 'grit' as a character trait of your own.

- **Get creative!** Using old magazines/newspapers in your home, collect a variety of images/words and cut and paste them onto a blank piece of paper to create an image of your choice.



- **Find a rock** in your garden/out on a daily walk. Take your rock home and see what kind of design you can come up with to paint it! If you don't have any paints, you could use markers to design your rock instead.



- **Use whatever materials** you have at home and see what kind of creative art piece you can create on your own! Email pictures to your class teacher so they can see what you have used in your home to create something beautiful.

- **Monday 8th June is Trinity.** Your child might enjoy writing an acrostic poem or a prayer to celebrate this day. Do look at the 'Believe, Belong, Become' section of the school website which has more detail and guidance on Trinity.
