

Timeline 7000 BCE - Settlement of Nile Valley begins. 3000 BCE - Kingdoms of Upper and Lower Egypt unite. 2500BC– Pyramids begin to be built 669 BCE - Assyrians from Mesopotamia conquer and rule Egypt. 525 BCE - Persian conquest. 332 BCE - Alexander the Great, of ancient Macedonia, conquers Egypt, founds Alexandria. A Macedonian dynasty rules until 31 BC. 31 BCE - Egypt comes under Roman rule; Queen Cleopatra 's reign ends after Octavian's army defeats her forces.
